We don't have those little white Chinese food takeout boxes in Canada. Growing up watching sitcoms that took place in New York, I developed a probably-too-strong association between those takeout boxes and my secretly harbored dream of living as an adult in my own apartment in New York City working in theatre and ordering Chinese food late at night while writing my next show.

From the moment I set foot on the campus at NYU Tisch where I would come to spend two years in the Graduate Musical Theatre Writing Program, I was mentored, pushed, and inspired by professors and colleagues without whom I would not be anywhere close to where I am today. I have had the opportunity

to workshop scenes with actors including Philippa Soo and directors including Nick Corley. Our show received a developmental workshop with Jennifer Jancuska (Resident Choreographer of Broadway's "Hamilton"), where we delved deeply into the characters and put parts of the show up on its feet for the first time. I have been offered a spot in the Prospect Musical Theatre Lab, where I had the opportunity to work with a director and actors in the development of a brand new ten-minute piece which was presented at Symphony Space to a kind and generous audience. Now, that same director, Dev Bondarin, is leading the first-ever fully staged production of mine and my collaborator's full-length musical, "The Garden Bridge" (proudly a member of MainStreet's Library!) in the SheNYC Summer Festival at Classic Stage Company.

Last week, 10 minutes before my meeting with the director of my original musical's upcoming Off-Broadway debut, I ran out to grab Chinese food from my favorite spot around the corner. I then sat in my New York City apartment while my director and I discussed costume ideas for the show. It really can happen.

The importance of support and collaboration in the development of new musicals cannot be overstated. I could sit alone at my desk for hours staring at the script and never learn half as much as I do in five minutes in a room with a director or actors or designers. I have watched the rehearsal process for "The Garden Bridge" in utter awe at the gold that the cast and team have managed to mine from beneath the words on the page. It is for this reason that I am eternally grateful to the people and organizations who dedicate themselves to the development of new musicals and the fostering of early collaborations that help them thrive. Without these people and the work that they do, I might still be sitting at a desk chair in Canada harboring unfulfilled dreams and eating chow mein out of regular old takeout containers.


